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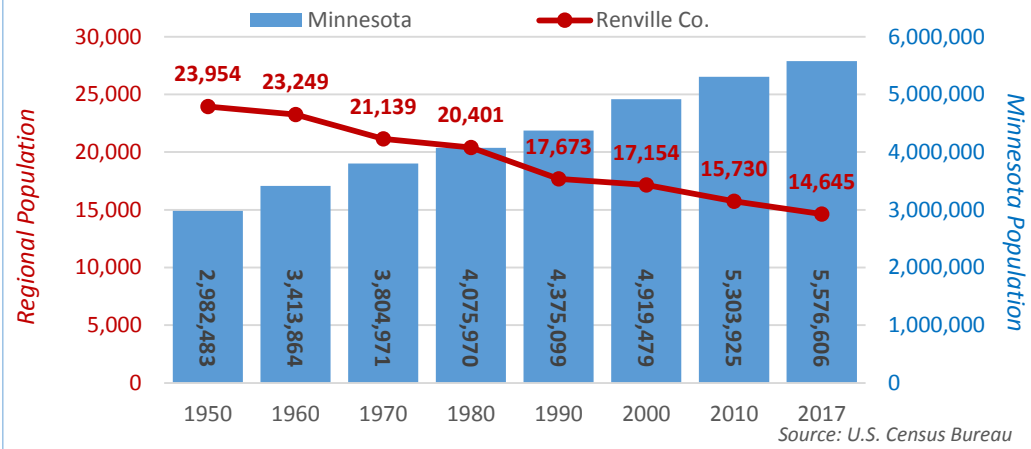

Figure 1. Population Change, 1950-2017

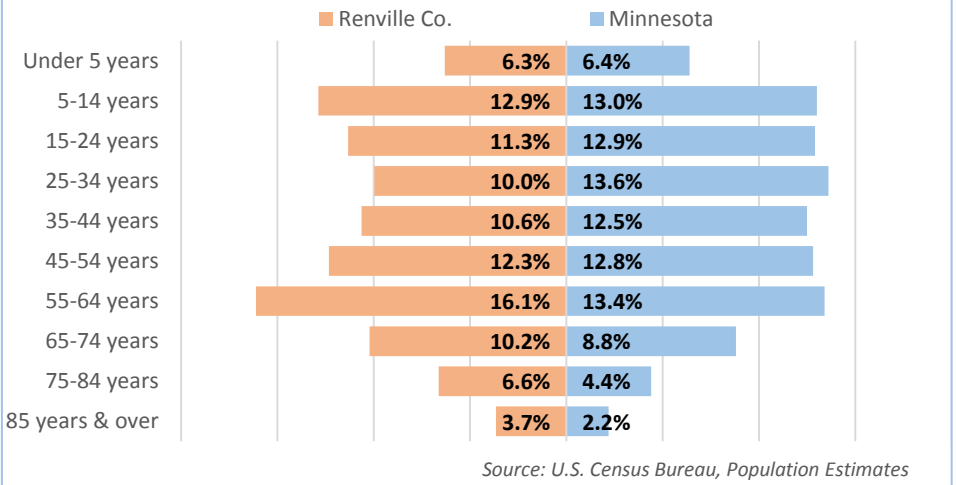

Figure 2. Percentage of Population by Age Group, 2017

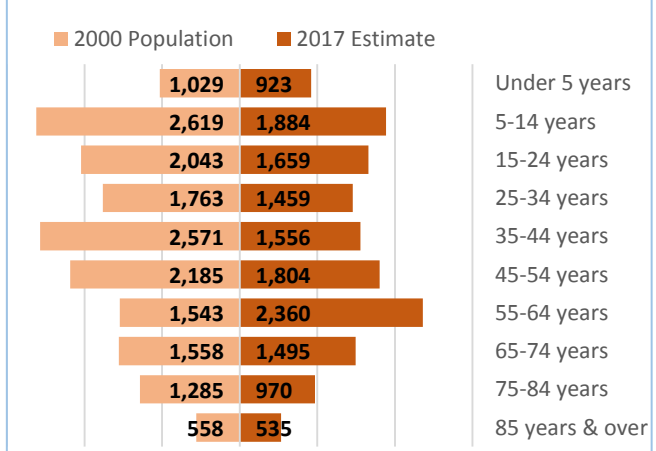

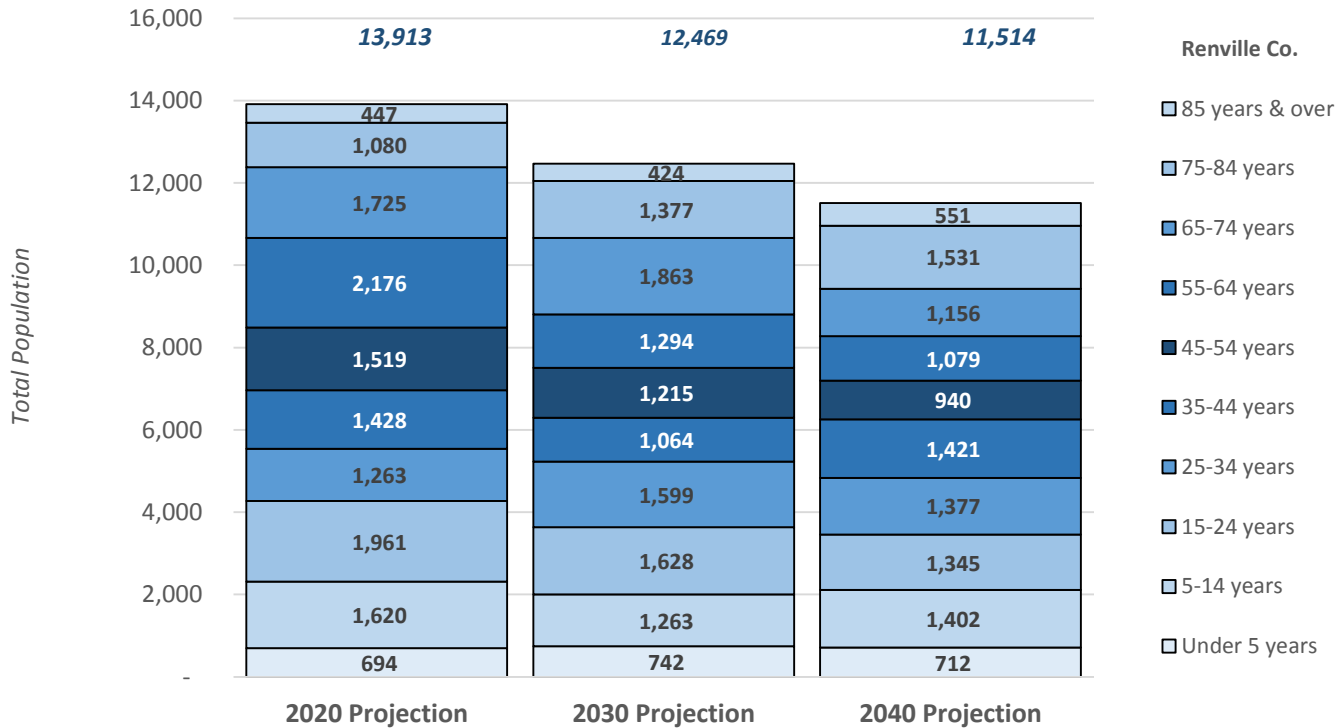

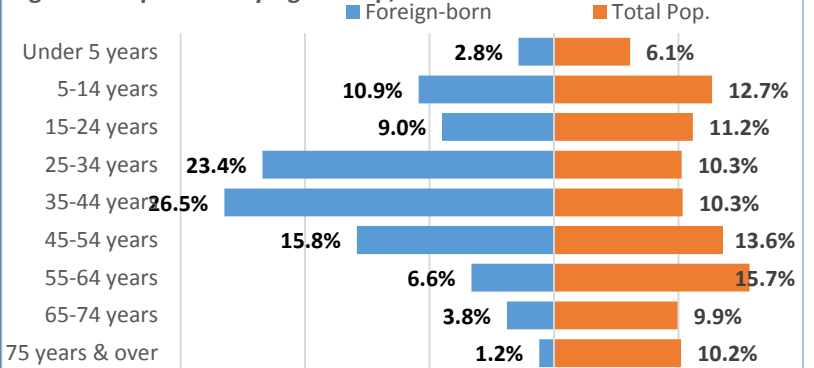

Figure 6. Annual Labor Force Estimates, 2000-2018

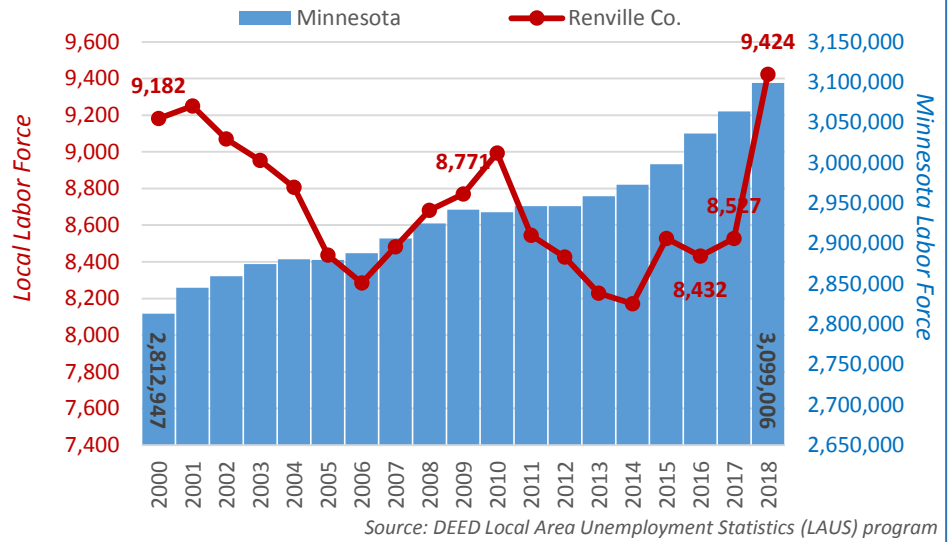


Figure 7. Unemployment Rates, 2000-2018

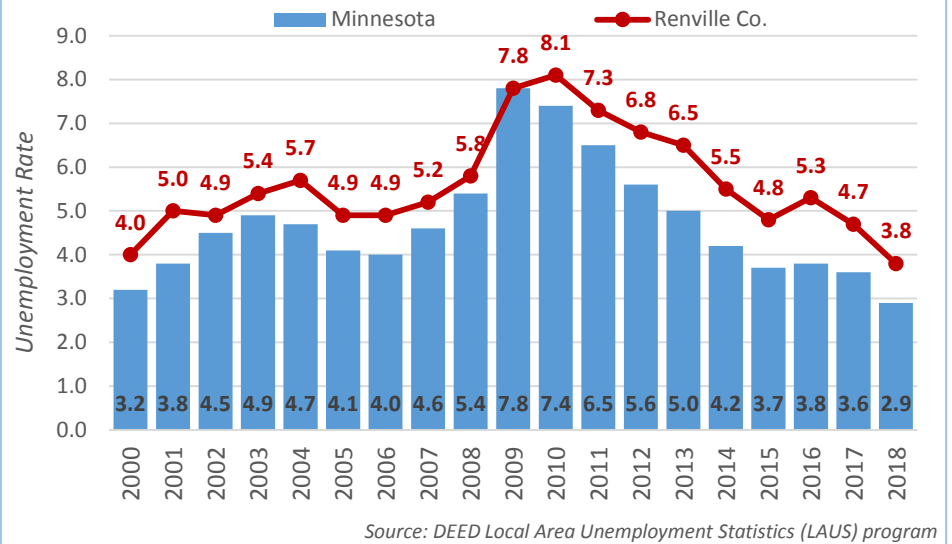


Figure 8. Jobseekers Per Vacancy, 2008-2018

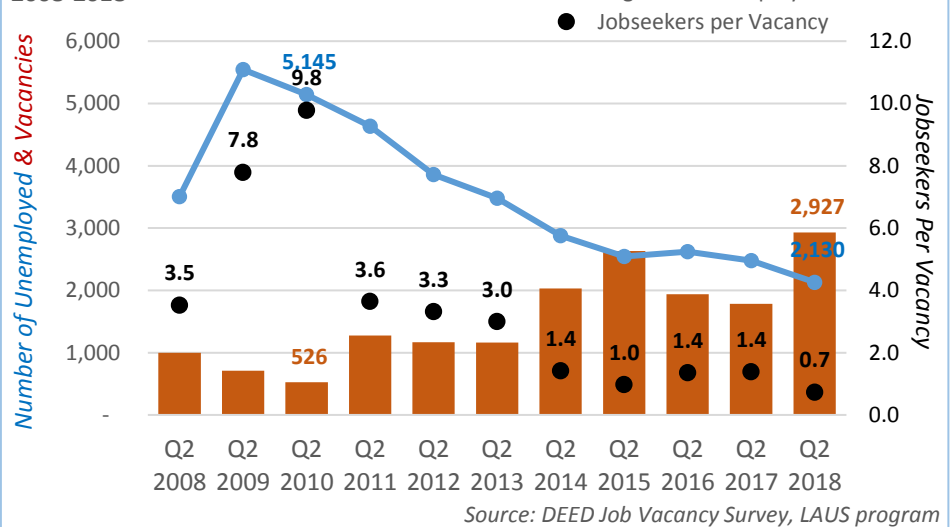

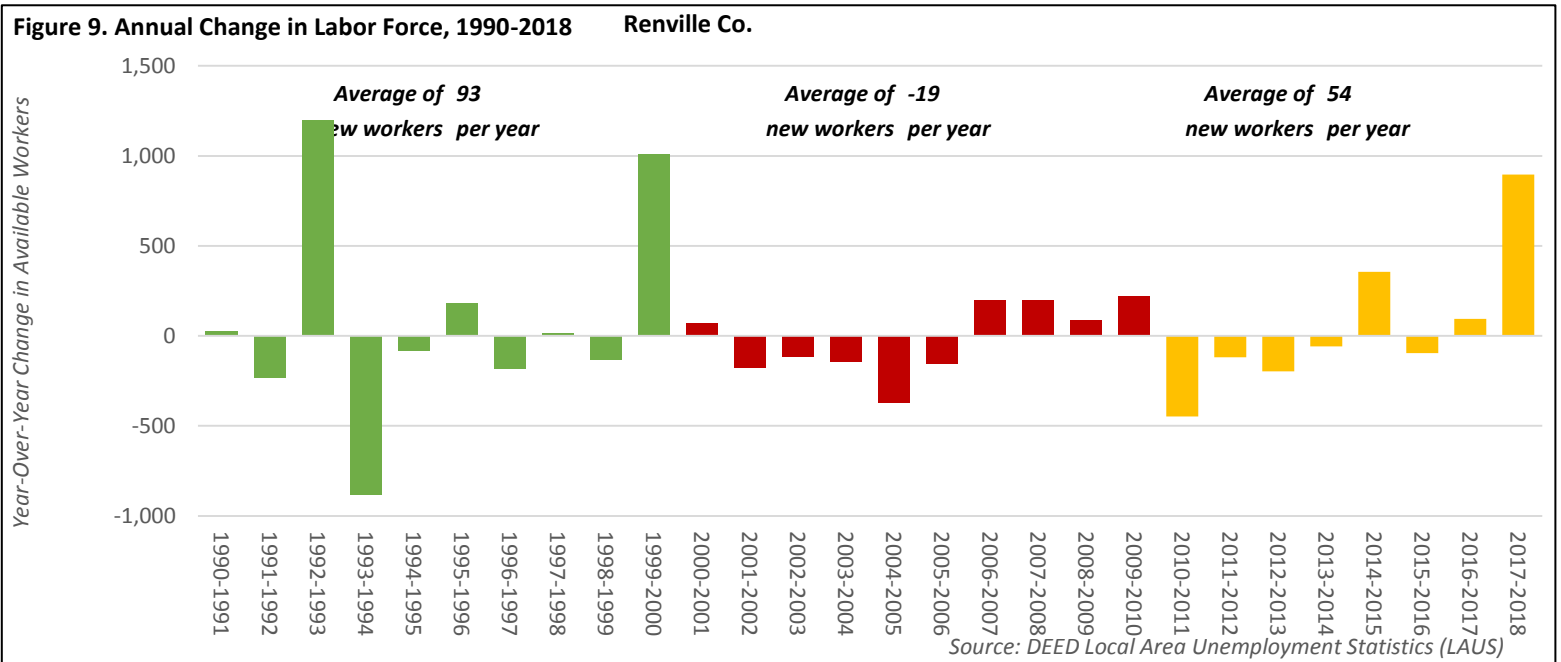

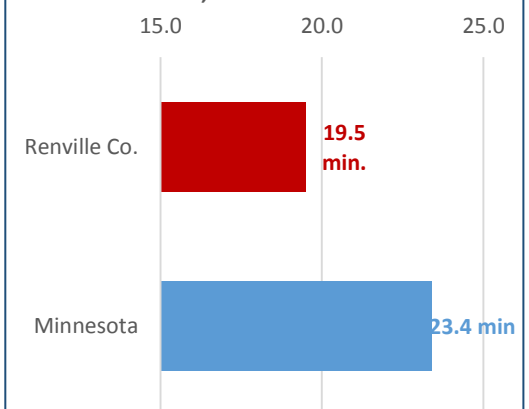

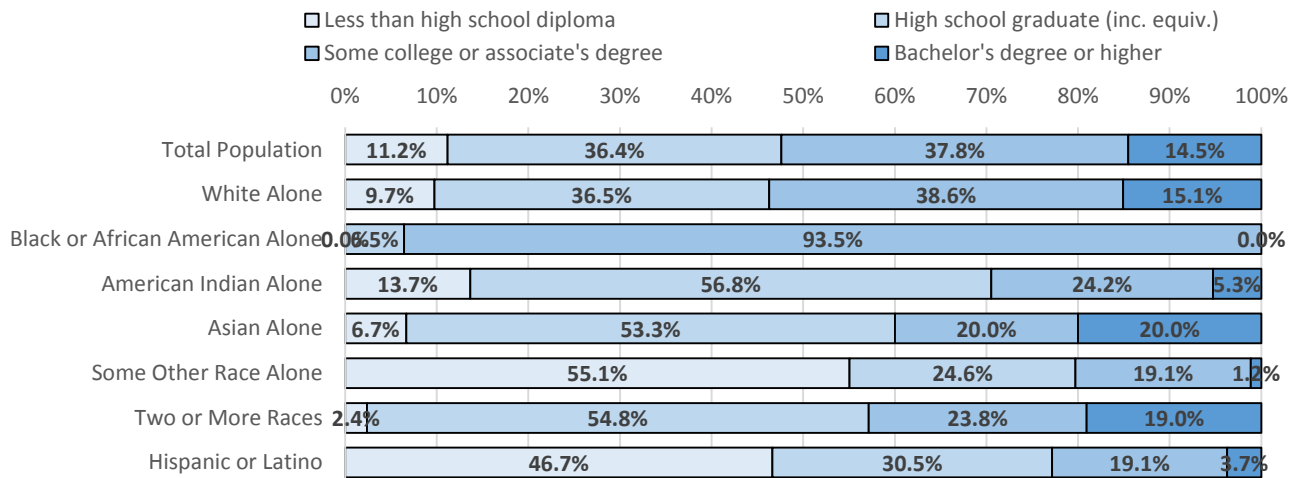

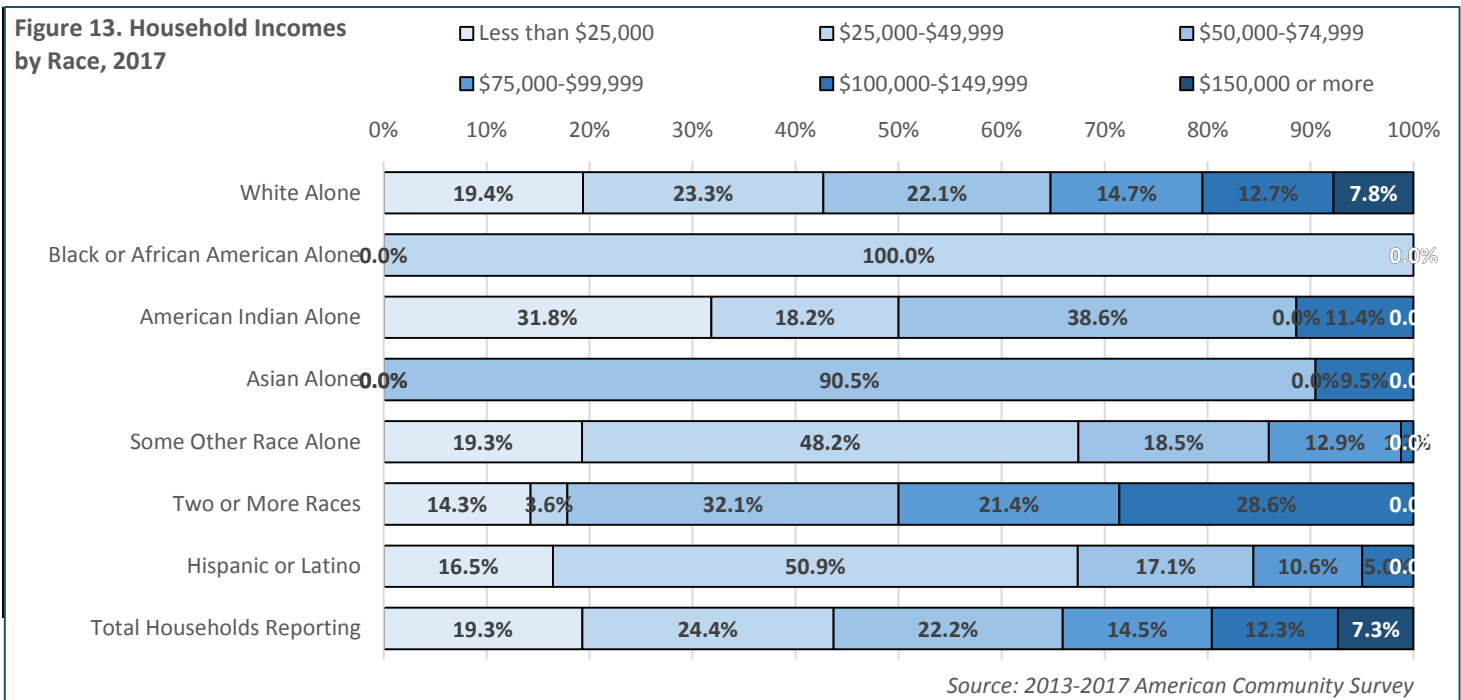

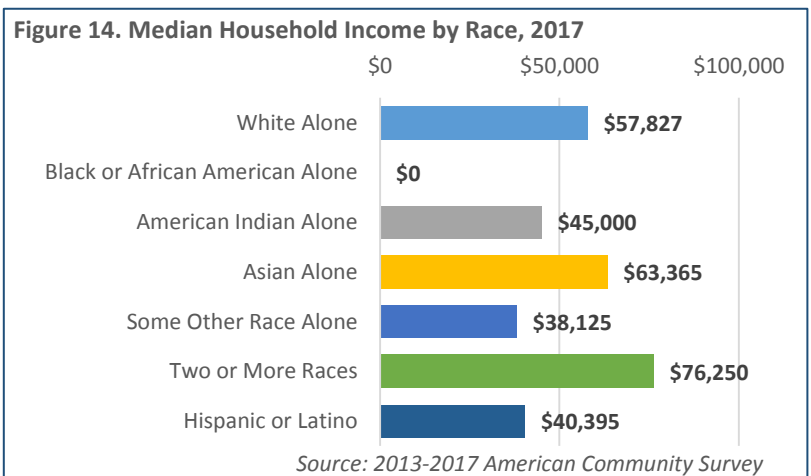

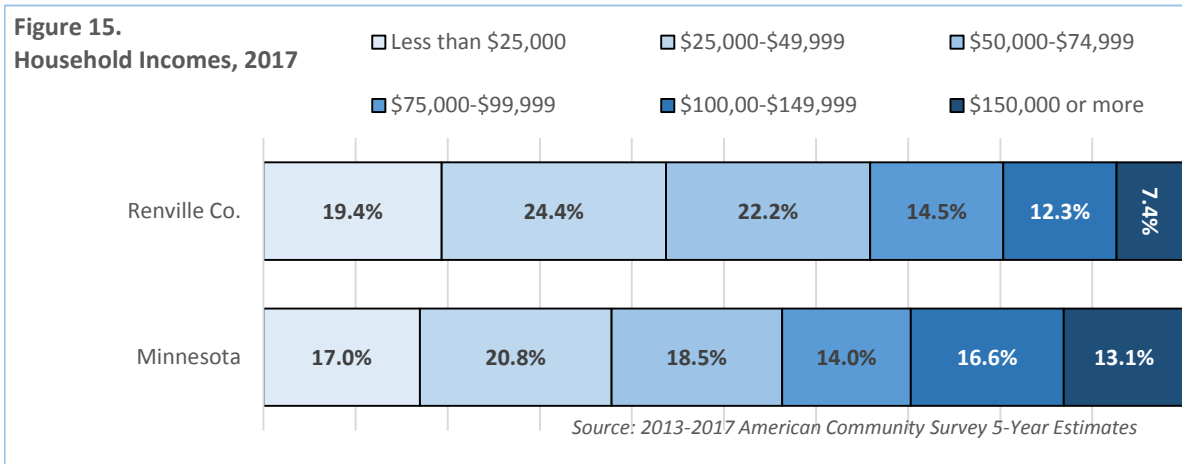

Figure 16. Job Vacancies by Industry, Qtr. 2 2018

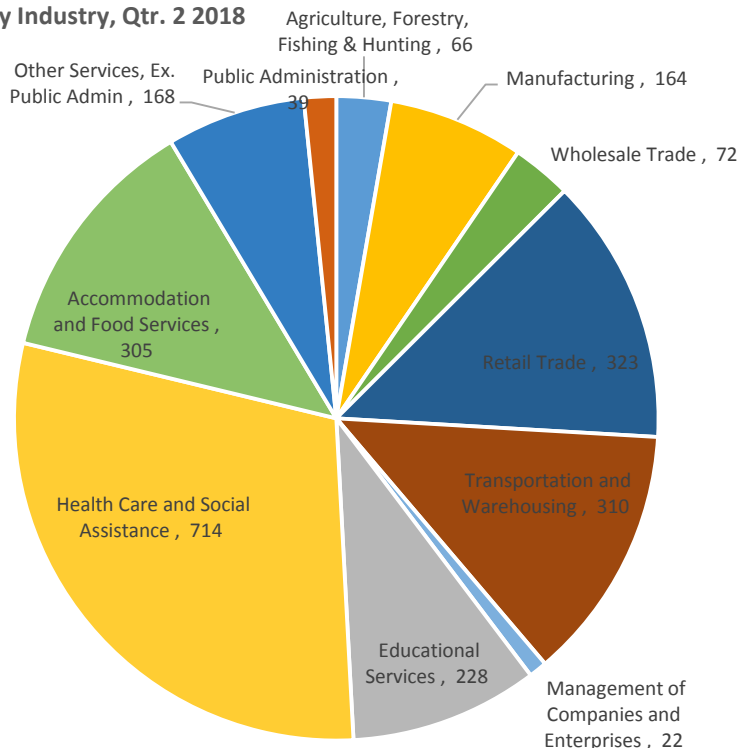
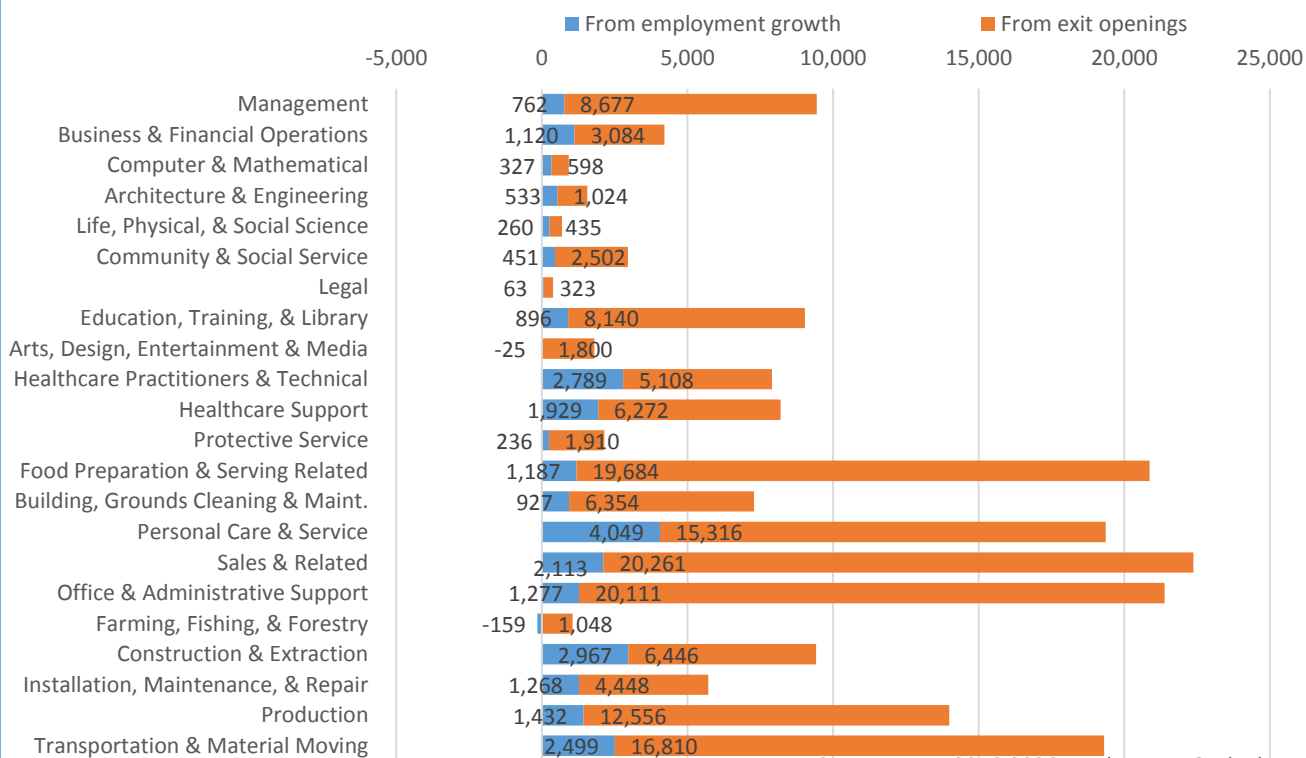

Figure 18. Share of Jobs by Educational Requirements, 2018

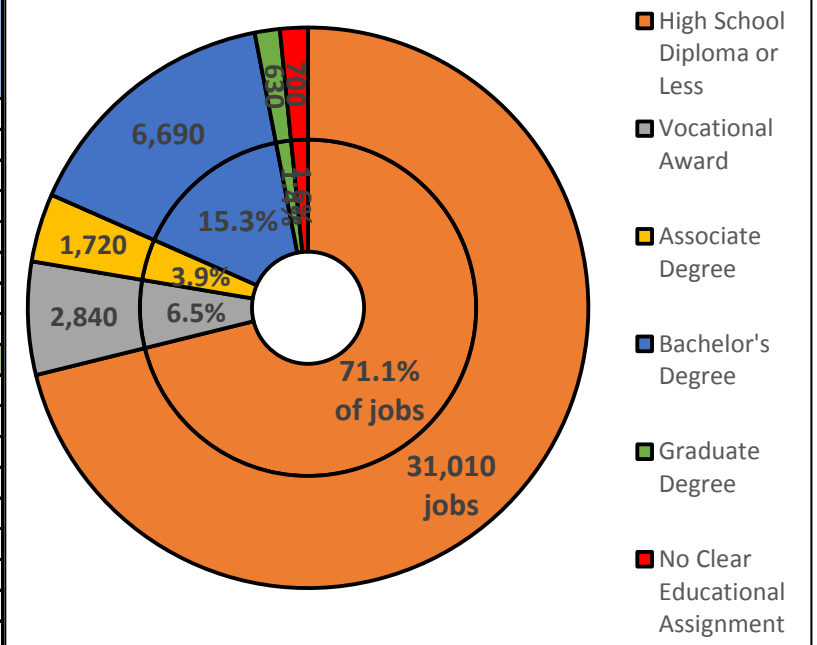

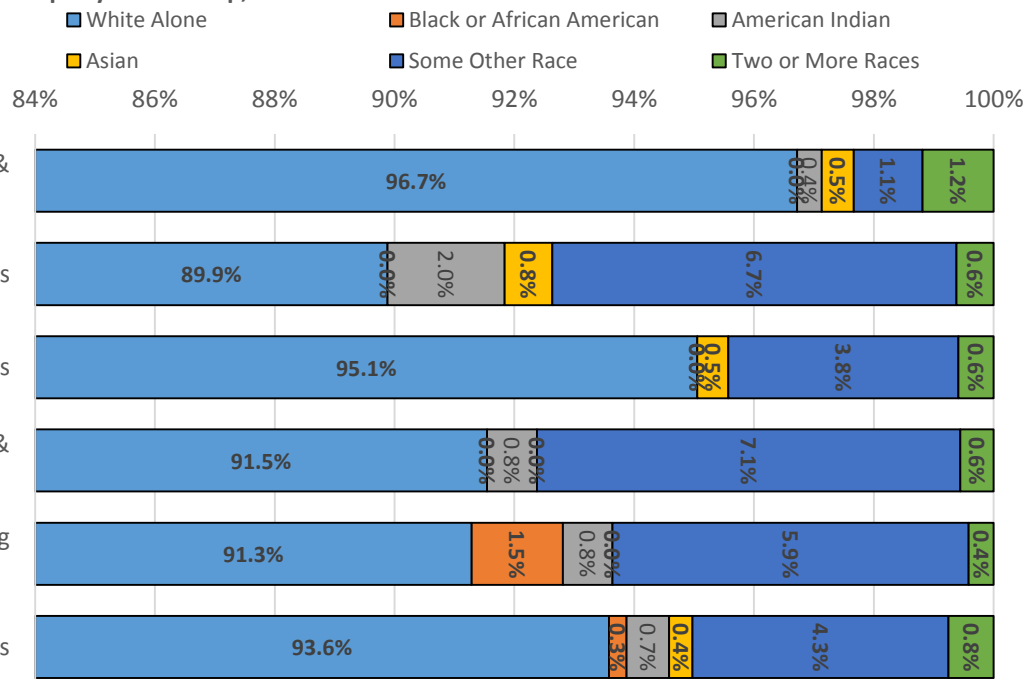

Figure 19. Percent of Occupational Groups by Race Group, 2017



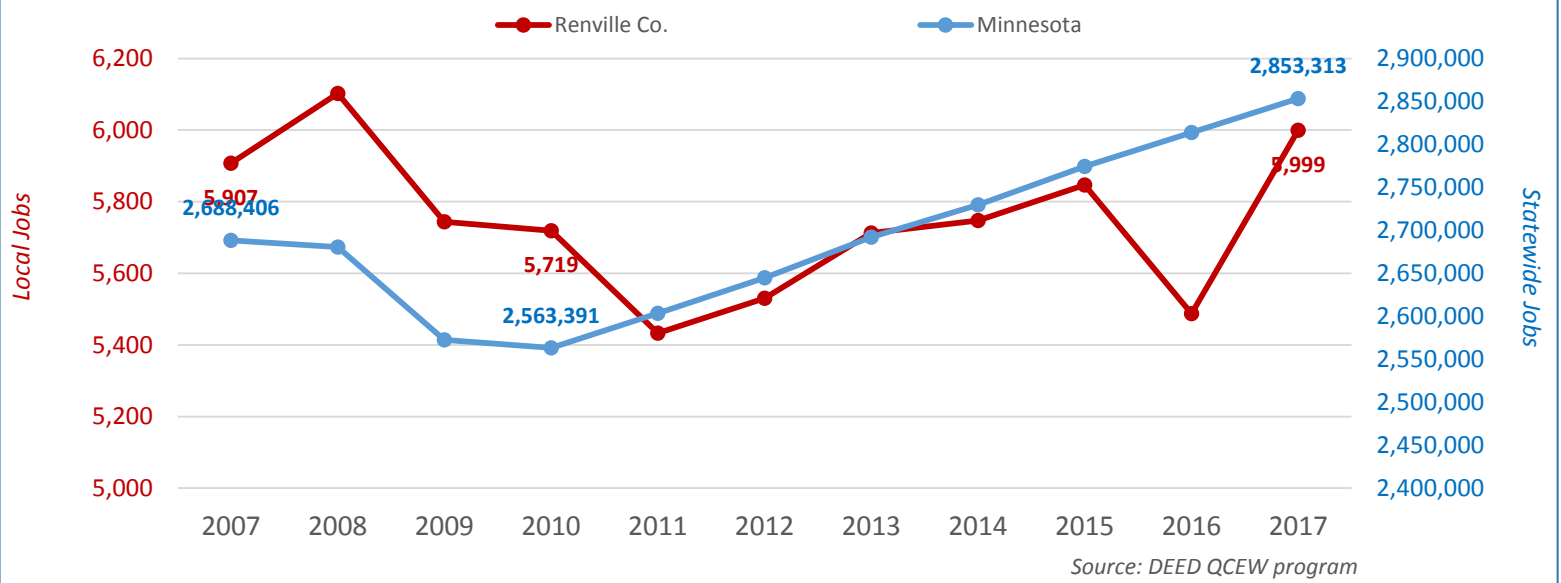

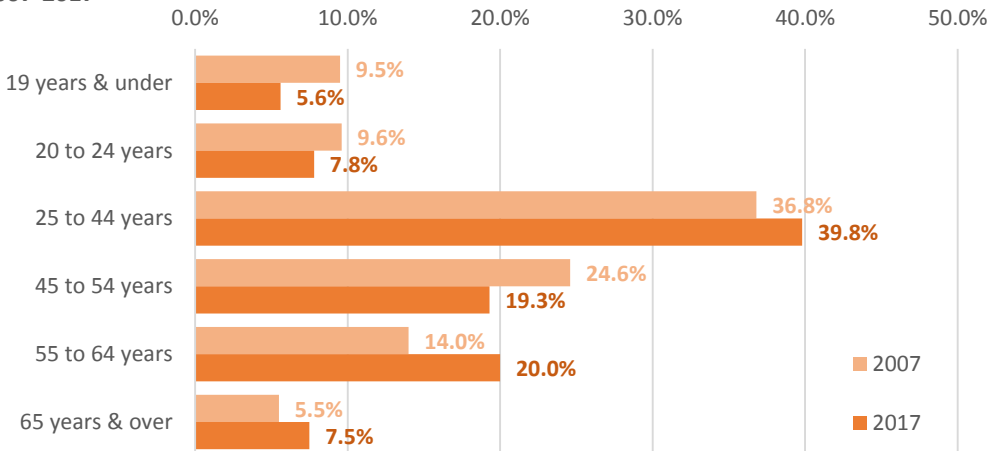

Figure 22. Percentage of Workforce by Gender, Total of All Industries, 2017

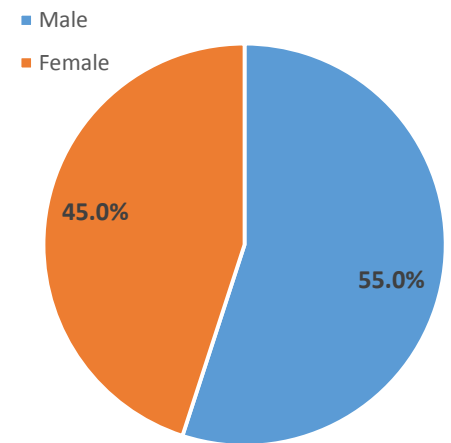
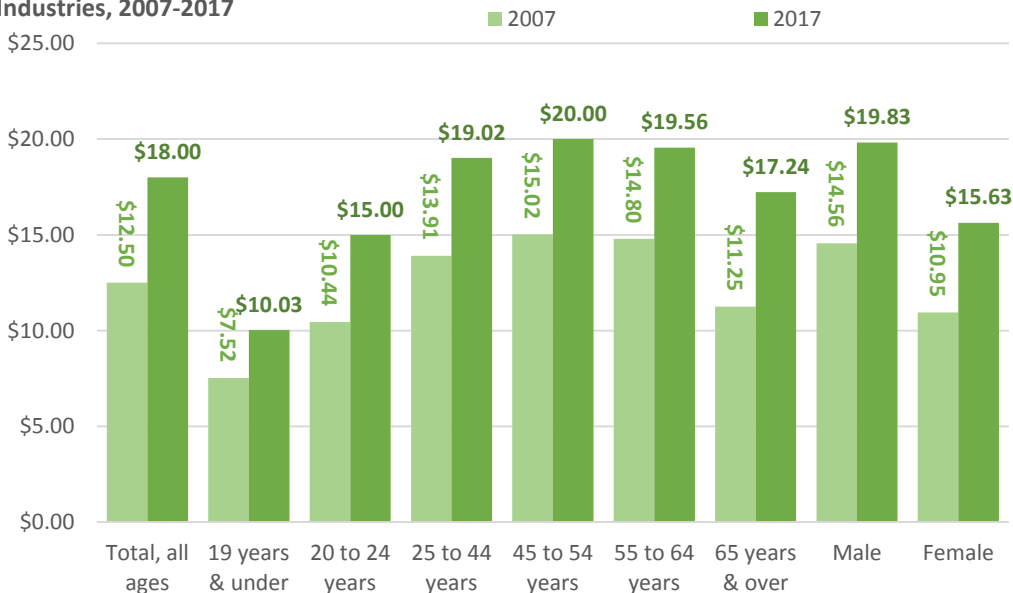
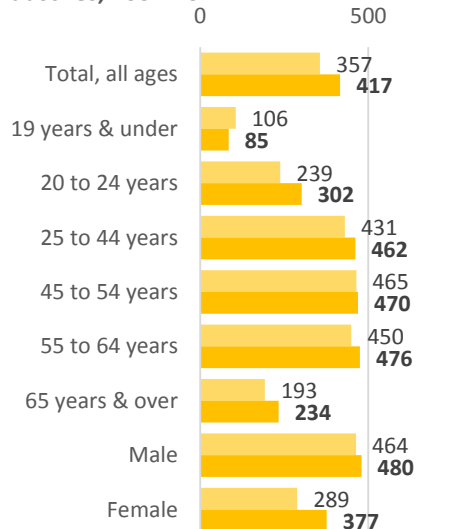


Figure 23. Median Hourly Wage by Age Group and Gender, Total of All Industries, 2007-2017

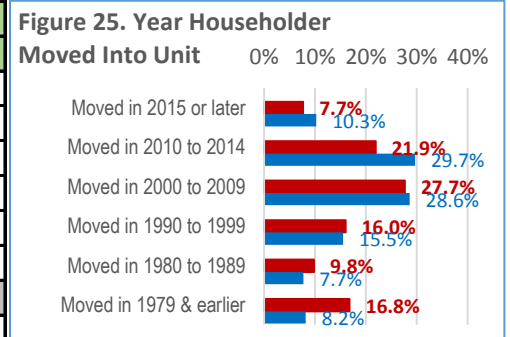

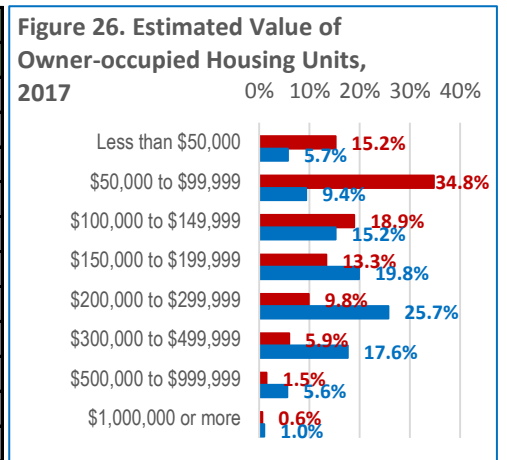


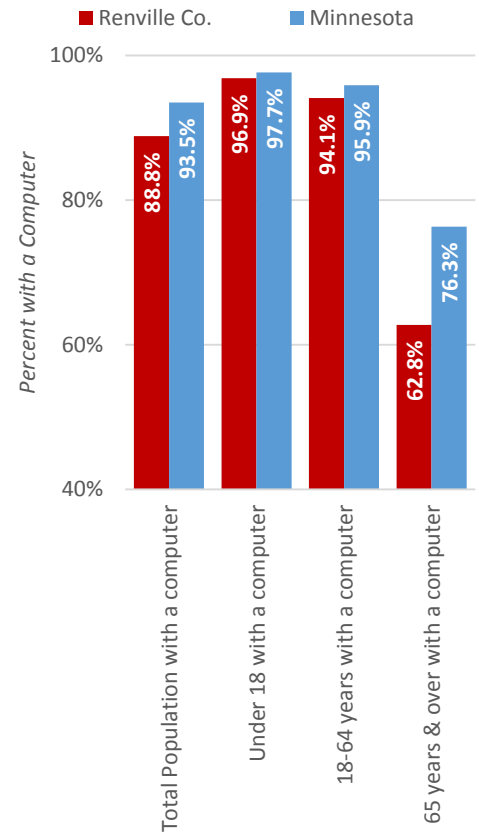
